

ROYAL ACADEMY OF ARTS COLLABORATES WITH BBC ARTS IN MAJOR PARTNERSHIP TO CELEBRATE THE SUMMER EXHIBITION



This summer, the Royal Academy of Arts is collaborating with BBC Arts in a major partnership to celebrate the *Summer Exhibition 2014*. This will comprise coverage on BBC Arts Online, a BBC Two programme and an exhibition of works by the finalists from *The One Show Summer Art Competition 2014*.

The Summer Exhibition is the world's largest open submission exhibition, it provides a unique platform for emerging and established artists to showcase their works to an international audience, comprising a range of media from painting to printmaking, photography, sculpture, architecture and film.

To mark the rich history of the Royal Academy and the annual Summer Exhibition, now in its 246 year, BBC Arts Online will produce a series of features drawn from the RA's archive. To coincide with the launch of BBC Arts Online on 14 May, the first feature will look back at the Summer Exhibition of 1914, revealing the story of a Suffragette's attack on one of the most notable pictures of the Exhibition, a portrait Henry James, the novelist, painted by John Singer Sargent RA.

BBC Arts Online will also offer a deeper insight into the *Summer Exhibition 2014* with streamed tours of the exhibition with the Royal Academicians Tracey Emin and Norman Ackroyd, along with special guest Alex Jones, presenter of The One Show. An online representation of *Symphony Of A Missing Room: Archive Of The Forgotten And Remembered* an experiential artwork by the Swedish artists Christer Lundahl and Martina Seitl will also be available to view. Presented by LIFT and the RA, Lundahl & Seitl's immersive tours will lead viewers through the RA's public and private spaces, giving a unique insight into the Summer Exhibition and revealing the Royal Academy as never before.

On 7 June, the *Summer Exhibition 2014* will take centre stage in the BBC's new strand of programming *BBC ARTS At...* to be broadcast on BBC 2. Presenters Kirsty Wark, Alastair Sooke and Morgan Quaintance will take viewers on a journey from behind-the-scenes of the making of the exhibition to the glamorous Summer Exhibition Preview Party.

BBC Arts At... the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition 2014 will cover the judging process of the 12,000 works submitted this year, along with the hanging of the exhibition. Highlights include interviews with a selection of newly elected Academicians, including Conrad Shawcross, Yinka Shonibare and Bob & Roberta Smith whose work will be on prominent display, and an interview with Cornelia Parker RA who will be curating a black and white themed room, featuring works by artists David Batchelor and Ackroyd and Harvey, amongst others. Along with well-known artists, the BBC

will be following a number of up-and-coming artists whose work has successfully been selected to hang in the show.

From 16 June – 9 August, the Royal Academy will present *The One Show Summer Art Exhibition 2014* in the historic Reynolds Room. *The One Show Summer Art Competition 2014* was open to amateur artists living in the UK and split in two age categories: 13 – 17 years old and 18 and over. From over 1000 submissions, a selection of 24 shortlisted works will go on display at the RA. A panel, including Michael Landy RA, Edith Devaney, Head of Summer Exhibition, Royal Academy of Arts, Nick Grimshaw, BBC Radio 1's Breakfast Show host, and the actress Maureen Lipman, will judge twelve shortlisted entries from each category. The winners will be announced on The One Show in July, with two new works by the winners joining the exhibition.

Charles Saumarez Smith, Secretary and Chief Executive of the Royal Academy of Arts, said: "We are delighted to be working on this major partnership with the BBC to coincide with the Summer Exhibition. With such a broad range of coverage, we are able to open up access to a far wider audience, inviting them to see what is happening in the art world right now. As the spiritual home for artists and art lovers, the Royal Academy provides a natural setting to host *The One Show Summer Art Exhibition 2014*, which gives further insight into the artistic talent from across the country."

Jonty Claypole, Director of Arts, BBC, said: "The Summer Exhibition is one of the most important events in the cultural calendar and I'm delighted that this year, the BBC will be exploring it in such depth. From BBC Radio 1's Nick Grimshaw judging The One Summer Show Art Competition to an experiential artwork on BBC Arts Online and BBC Arts at ...on BBC Two, we'll be taking unique look at the *Summer Exhibition 2014* across TV, radio and online."
