Documents prove that it was acquired by an English dealer in 1802. It was rediscovered only very recently, identified as a painting by Moroni and sold from a British collection in 2013 to an English dealer, suggesting that the painting remained in the UK after it was sold from the renowned Lechi collection in 1832.
