The Royal Academy's engineering team maintains lighting in its shop, galleries, restaurant and offices across 2 adjacent historic buildings. This role is principally to provide basic lighting maintenance and repairs for both buildings.

The Royal Academy has a very busy schedule of events that require the successful operation of its audio visual system. As a secondary task, the role supports the Audio Visual Supervisor.

MAIN DUTIES:

- Maintain & repair all exhibition, office and general lighting equipment.
