Acclaimed British painter, Jock McFadyen RA will be the co-ordinator of the 251<sup>st</sup> Summer Exhibition. McFadyen, alongside the Summer Exhibition Committee intends to build on the exhibition's success, recognising that it continues to provide a unique platform for artists at all stages of their career to present recent work.

Highlights within the Main Galleries will include a 'menagerie' in the Central Hall curated by Jock McFadyen RA, with works by artists including Polly Morgan, Charles Avery and Mat Collishaw. Jane and Louise Wilson RA will organise two gallery spaces, one of which will showcase light and time based work. Spencer de Grey RA will curate the Architecture Gallery, which will explore the theme of sustainability.

The celebrated artist Thomas Houseago will show a group of large-scale sculptural works in the Royal Academy's Annenberg Courtyard that respond to the Academy's statue of Joshua Reynolds, which has stood in the courtyard since 1931. This will be the first time that the courtyard will be dedicated to an artist that is not a Royal Academician as part of the Summer Exhibition.

Further artists exhibiting in this year's Summer Exhibition include Jeremy Deller and Marcus Harvey alongside Royal Academicians such as Tracey Emin RA, Gary Hume RA, David Nash RA, Wolfgang Tillmans RA and Honorary Royal Academicians, Anselm Kiefer and James Turrell. The celebrated German filmmaker and photographer Wim Wenders Hon RA will be taking over the free McAulay Galleries, with a series of panoramic photographs.

The Summer Exhibition is the world's largest open submission contemporary art show which has taken place every year without interruption since 1769. The members of the Summer Exhibition Committee serve in rotation, ensuring that every year the exhibition has a distinctive character, with each Royal Academician responsible for a particular gallery space. Works from all over the world are judged democratically on merit and the final selection is made during the eight-day hang in the galleries. This year the Royal Academy received over 16,000 entries. Around 1200 works, in a range of media, will go on display, the majority of which will be for sale offering visitors an opportunity to purchase original work.

A significant part of funds raised continue to contribute to financing the postgraduate students at the RA Schools.

### **History of the Summer Exhibition**

One of the founding principles of the Royal Academy of Arts was to "mount an annual exhibition open to all artists of distinguished merit" to finance the training of young artists in the Royal Academy Schools. The Summer Exhibition has been held every year without interruption since 1769 and continues to play a significant part in raising funds to finance the students of the RA Schools. The RA Schools is the longest established art school in the UK and offers the only free three-year postgraduate programme in Europe. As the world's largest open submission contemporary art show, the Summer Exhibition provides a unique platform for emerging and established artists to showcase their works to an international audience, comprising a range of media from painting and printmaking to photography, sculpture, architecture and film. Royal Academicians are automatically entitled to submit up to six works to the

Summer Exhibition and the rest of the exhibition features work by those invited by the committee and external entrants.

## The Royal Academy of Arts celebrates Art in Mayfair

Following the Royal Academy's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations last year, the Summer Exhibition will once again spill out onto the streets of London's West End throughout the summer, as part of Art in Mayfair. Taking over Bond Street, the Royal Academician Sir Michael Craig-Martin CBE will decorate the street with an installation of flags displaying his artwork.

Art in Mayfair sees the Royal Academy of Arts collaborate with Bond Street to unveil an array of art inspired windows, showcases and pop-ups across world-leading fashion and fine jewellery brands this summer, transforming Bond Street into a series of rich and diverse art installations from 10 - 24 June, coinciding with the Royal Academy's Summer Exhibition. Last summer's event saw brands such as Louis Vuitton, Fenwick of Bond Street, Hermès, Victoria Beckham, IWC, Longchamp, Smythson, La Perla, Ermenegildo Zegna, Pal Zileri, Jimmy Choo, Mikimoto, Jaeger Le-Coultre, Amanda Wakeley, Montblanc, TODS and Temperley London celebrate the Royal Academy and the rich heritage of Art in Mayfair.
