

in 1954: Chichio Haller (Zürich, Switzerland)





Hon. the eighth Earl of Roden, R.N.; his sale, Sotheby's, London, March 6, 1957, Lot 175, sold for £1,550; acquired by Edward Speelman; Vitale Bloch, The Hague and Paris; Lore and Dr. Rudolf Heinemann, New York; bequeathed by Lore Heinemann to the Frick Collection, New York, in memory of her husband, Dr. Rudolf J. 




