

RICHARD WILSON RA PRESENTS WORK BY CELEBRATED ARTISTIC DUOS IN SUMMER EXHIBITION 2016

13 June – 21 August 2016 Main Galleries

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The Royal Academy of Arts' 248th Summer Exhibition is coordinated by the renowned British sculptor and Royal Academician Richard Wilson. Comprising a range of media, the Summer Exhibition, the world's largest open submission exhibition, provides a unique platform for emerging and established artists and architects to showcase their recent work to an international audience. As this year's coordinator, Richard Wilson presents a thought-provoking Summer Exhibition, integrating work by celebrated artistic duos.

Richard Wilson has invited a diverse group of more than 20 international artistic duos, whose work he has long admired and which also reflects his interest in the making process, to exhibit throughout the Main Galleries. On display for the first time as part of the Summer Exhibition, Gilbert & George present *BEARD AWARE* (2016); a major new picture from the artist's ongoing group of work that references beards and barbed wire, and explores the ways in which both serve as devices to protect, disguise, intrigue and repel in the past, present and future. Jane & Louise Wilson have created an atmospheric photographic installation, using a number of large-scale works from the artists' seminal series *Chernobyl* (2010 – 2012); this new installation is exhibited around the main staircase leading up to the Summer Exhibition. Further highlights include a new suspended kite sculpture by Heather & Ivan Morison and a new life-size sculpture *The New Arrival* (2016) by Jake & Dinos Chapman. Participating artistic duos include Ilya & Emilia Kabakov, EVA & ADELE, Boyd & Evans, Tim Noble & Sue Webster, Langlands & Bell and Pierre et Gilles, among others.

Richard Wilson has also invited Turkish filmmaker and artist Kutluğ Ataman and Japanese artist Aono Fumiaki to present works within the Summer Exhibition. Suspended across the ceiling of Gallery 1 is Ataman's monumental, multi-image, video installation *THE PORTRAIT OF SAKIP SABANCI* (2014), which forms part of the Sabanci University Sakip Sabanci Museum Collection, Istanbul. Previously showcased in The Arsenale at the 56th International Venice Biennale in 2015, the video installation was originally commissioned by the Sakip Sabanci family in 2011 to mark the ten year anniversary of the passing of Turkish business leader and philanthropist Mr. Sakip

Sabanci. It is formed of approximately 10,000 LCD panels - each one an individual portrait of one of the tens of thousands of people who crossed paths with him. The exhibition also includes a small group of poignant floor and wall-based works by Aono Fumiaki, which explore the theme of reform, healing and rebirth in reference to the Great East Japan earthquake of 2011. Through this ongoing body of work, produced by the artist since 2011, Fumiaki strives to reconcile and restore fragments of salvaged broken objects left behind by those most affected by the earthquake, transforming them into new sculptural works.

As part of the Summer Exhibition 2016, architect and sculptor Ron Arad RA has created a new site-specific installation for the RA Courtyard. *Spyre* is a 16-metre high corten steel oval cone, hiding motors, cogs, and slew-rings. Each segment of *Spyre* will move at different speeds, ensuring that the unpredictable acrobatic postures of the installation are never repeated. At the tip of *Spyre* is an eye holding a camera, the footage from which is relayed to a screen on the façade of the RA.

This year the RA received 12,000 entries, from which a committee of Royal Academicians made a selection to hang on the walls of the Main Galleries in Burlington House. 1,240 artworks are on display, the majority of which are for sale offering visitors an opportunity to purchase original artwork by high profile and up-and-coming artists. For the very first time, many editions of artworks on display at the Summer Exhibition are available to purchase online via the RA's website.

One of the founding principles of the Royal Academy of Arts was to mount an annual exhibition open to all artists of distinguished merit to finance the training of young artists in the Royal Academy Schools. The Summer Exhibition has been held every year without interruption since 1769 and continues to play a significant part in raising funds to finance the current students of the RA Schools. The RA Schools is the longest established art school in the UK and offers the only free three-year postgraduate programme in Europe.

Richard Wilson RA, coordinator of the Summer Exhibition 2016, said: "The Summer Exhibition 2016 is unpredictable, stimulating, and enjoyable with 10 startling rooms of contemporary art submitted from around the world by members, non-members and honorary invitees. Each of the rooms has been hung by a member of the committee, resulting in themes of free speculation, practice or technique. As part of this year's exhibition, I have invited a diverse group of international artistic duos to participate with new or recent work. It cannot be over emphasised that profits from the exhibition will go towards funding the postgraduate programme at the RA Schools."
