

# **Application Guidelines**

Starr Fellowship 2014/15

## Who Should Apply?

The Starr Fellowship is an artist's residency at the Royal Academy Schools, the Royal Academy of Arts' school of contemporary fine art. The Fellowship is available to emerging American artists and the core of the programme is the development of the artist's own work in their studio. The Fellowship also offers opportunities to contribute to group critiques on our postgraduate programme.

The Starr Fellowship runs from October 2014 to July 2015. The successful candidate is provided with a private studio measuring 5.3 metres by 3.3 metres, located in the RA Schools. They will also receive a stipend of 12,000 GBP that is distributed in three instalments, at the beginning of each term. This is an opportunity for an artist with US citizen status to create work within the RA Schools for an academic year, culminating with a solo show at the RA Schools in July, viewable by appointment.

All our facilities are available to the Starr Fellow, including our Digital Media Suite, Sculpture Workshop, Video Editing Suite, Printmaking Studios and Library. Every one of these areas is staffed term-time by a tutor who is also a practicing artist. The Starr Fellow is also very welcome to attend the Lectures and Artist's Talks that form a part of our postgraduate programme. The Starr Fellowship is made possible through the support of the Starr Foundation, which was established in 1955 by Cornelius Vander Starr, an insurance entrepreneur who founded C.V. Starr & Co. and other companies. Later these companies were merged by Starr's successor Maurice R. Greenberg into what became the American International Group Inc. Mr. Starr, a pioneer of globalisation, set up his first insurance venture in Shanghai in 1919. He died in 1968 at the age of 76, leaving his estate to the Starr Foundation.

#### **About the RA Schools**

The RA Schools is an independent school of contemporary fine art, proud to offer free tuition. Its three-year postgraduate course is designed to respond to the individual needs of each participant and offers the opportunity to be part of a unique and intimate community of artists. As part of the Royal Academy of Arts, it is Britain's first fine art school, found just behind the Academy's galleries on Piccadilly in central London. The RA Schools' constantly evolving programme attracts some of the most sought-after teaching staff, visiting artists and thinkers in the world.

## **Application Process**

- 1. Download the Application from the Starr Fellowship section of our website
- 2. Complete Personal Details + Education sections (Part 1)
- 3. Complete the Application Statement (**Part 2**). This should be no more than 500 words. Hand-written statements are not advised
- 4. Complete the Declaration
- 5. Complete the List of Works (Part 3) as per our conditions on Page 3
- 6. Pay the <u>application fee online here</u> then record the booking reference number you will receive on your application in **Part 1**
- 7. Send the Reference (**Part 4**) to your referee: an artist or an art professional who is familiar with you and your work.
- 8. Include your reference when posting your application to the Royal Academy Schools or ask your referee to email it directly to us at <a href="mailto:raschoolsadmissions@royalacademy.org.uk">raschoolsadmissions@royalacademy.org.uk</a>. Make sure that your referee is aware of the deadline
- 9. Enclose your CV.
- 10. Post your Application to the Royal Academy Schools or deliver it by hand between the hours of 09:00 17:00 (weekdays only)
  - We will not be open on Friday 18 April 2014 and Monday 21 April 2014 to accept hand delivered applications
- 11. We will not accept application submitted after the deadline, Friday 2 May 2014

We guarantee that all correctly submitted applications are given careful consideration. We are unable to return any part of your application so do not include anything of value.

#### **List of Works**

Alongside your Application Statement please submit:

- Up to 16 images of (mostly) recent work
  - or
- Up to 15 minutes of (mostly) recent video work
  - or
- A proportion of both
- Do not send 16 images and 15 minutes of film. We will not be able to look through all of your work if you do

#### **Images**

- We only accept images in JPEG format on CD or DVD
- All images should be in RGB mode
- Dimensions should not exceed 1400 x 1050 (roughly 1.5MB in size)
- All images should be Mac compatible test your disc on a Mac before submitting your application
- Do not submit images in any other format. TIFF, PowerPoint, PDF, PSD formats etc. will not be accepted

#### Video

- We only accept video on a PAL format DVD
- If submitting time-based works, you should include a maximum of three works
- If your films are longer than five minutes we recommend submitting shorter extracts

#### Though useful, keep details of works to a minimum

Clearly label your disc with your full name

Do not supply original work or a portfolio of work to accompany your application. This will not be accepted and we are unable to return it.
